- Q: Terminating the presidency of Pamela Whitten: what does this add to the IGWC's approach?
 - We want to exhaust every avenue available to us
 - Historical vote of no confidence
- O: is the order of demands relevant?
 - Not necessarily
- Statement: the university cannot ignore this request if we bring it forth, it gives the faculty and other bodies precedent
- Statement: a letter from GPSG will make a response more realistic and show support for the IGWC
- Q: motion to amend to cut out the demands, is it necessary to have the demands in our letter
- Q: GPSG representation in the meeting with the Board of Trustees
 - Yes, but GPSG meets with BFC and BoT already
- motion to amend that we only mention the demands without their description
- Motion to keep the language of the demand letter in our statement, because this is an avenue to ensure that the demands are read by the Board of Trustees
- Support to include IGWC in the GPSG letter, but it should not be part of our endorsement
- Q: is the BoT aware of the demands, which letter would arrive first
- Q: GPSG is not endorsing any political views, we do not need to insert the demands
- No guarantee that the BoT will read this letter, but we need a clear statement that GPSG is not endorsing
- This body has voted no confidence in the administration, so worries of alienation are to some extend not in place
- Point of order: to keep 2 stack question
- Statement on why motion should pass
- Wording of letter makes it clear that these demands are coming from the IGWC
- Vote to amend
 - Amendment to reduce the language and not mention the demands
 - Yes:
